#### <u>Cars</u>

#### <u>Whatsapp</u>

If your child uses Whatsapp or any other social media platform, I would respectfully advise you to monitor the contents of any group chats. A number of such chats have been brought to my attention, either by upset children or concerned parents. Whilst as adults, we are used to these platforms being private unless consciously public, children have a less developed sense of restraint, resilience and emotional maturity.

#### National Tutoring Programme

We are now well into our first cohort of tutoring groups. Whilst there have been some technical hiccups, it has mostly gone smoothly. Since this is a flagship national strategy for helping children catch-up where some learning has been missed, we expect it to be a firm fixture in our school provision. The children who have taken part are really enjoying the tailored attention to their learning.

#### **UPDATED COVID-19 GUIDANCE**

## Should my child still go to their childcare or education setting if they test positive for Covid?

No. From 1 April, anyone with a positive COVID-19 test result will be advised to try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for five days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be three days.

#### Will my child's school or college still be taking measures to prevent Covid?

All settings should have in place baseline infection prevention and control measures that will help to manage the spread of infection:

- Ensuring all eligible groups are enabled and supported to take up the offer of national vaccination programmes including COVID-19 and flu.
- Ensuring occupied spaces are well-ventilated and let fresh air in.
- Reinforcing good hygiene practices such as hand washing and cleaning.

#### Can my child still get a Covid-19 vaccine?

From 1<sup>st</sup> April the in-school COVID-19 vaccination programme will come to an end. However, **12 to 15 year olds will still be able to access the vaccine outside of schools at a vaccination centre, pharmacy or walk-in centre**. Parents can book a <u>Covid-19 vaccination appointment online</u> or by speaking to their GP or calling 119. Alternatively, they can find a <u>walk-in Covid-19 vaccination site</u>.

From April, healthy 5-11 year olds will also be offered the COVID-19 vaccine. Vaccinations will take place outside of schools in vaccination centres, pharmacies,

GPs and walk-in centres. Parents of 5-11 year olds will receive a letter from the NHS with further information. <u>Online bookings</u> for 5-11 year olds will open in April.
